By now we're all familiar with those 'night at the museum' happenings, where cultured keen beans bed down for a kip in the hallowed halls of high art or natural history. Well, thanks to a German firm, that experience is about to get a whole lot more deluxe.

Sleeperoo might sound like a narcoleptic marsupial, but it's actually a moveable snooze pod that lets inhabitants stay overnight at a range of fascinating spots in comfort, privacy and style.

Bag a Sleeperoo in, for instance, the Energeticon adventure museum near Cologne, or performance-car mecca Motorworld near Stuttgart, or an 18th-century church near Weimar. In spring you can grab 40 winks in the Black Forest or spend a night on an alpaca farm too.

The pods come with a big, comfy, two-person mattress, a sheepskin rug, low-energy LED lights, panoramic windows, a skylight and locally sourced chill box with snacks, vegan condoms and yes, before you ask, booze. Book at sleeperoo.de for some eye-opening shuteye.
